

STAFF COUNSELOR/ STAFF PSYCHOLOGIST REGIS UNIVERSITY

The Staff Counselor/Staff Psychologist at Regis University will provide counseling and personal development services to students with a wide variety of developmental, mental health and collegiate transition issues. This position will maintain an individual clinical caseload of students on a daily basis in order to assist with developmental issues or more severe psychological concerns; provide crisis intervention, walk-in and on-call, when necessary; consult with appropriate Office of Counseling and Personal Development staff, consulting psychiatrist, after-hours emergency facility, with regard to decisions to send client home or to off-campus referral and/or to hospital; participate in after-hours on-call coverage; provide appropriate clinical documentation by maintaining appropriate case records in accordance with professional and ethical standards; and provide outreach to other departments on campus with regard to psychological issues including training for residence life staff, academic presentations, debriefing after a crisis and specific topic programs targeting certain populations upon request.

This person will provide consultation to faculty, staff and students as needed to assist with understanding of students' psychological needs; consult, collaborate and serve as resource to key departments, including Residence Life, Campus Safety, Athletics, Student Activities, Career Services, Health Services, Fitness, and University Ministry; participate in weekly staff meetings including case conferences and in-services; provide peer supervision/consultation; collaborate with Student Health Services and Residence Life on a weekly basis regarding psychological concerns of specific students where coordination of treatment/care is required; participate in professional development activities (conferences, workshops, specific skill training, supervision, and psychologist licensure preparation) in order to acquire and maintain required professional license; and perform related duties as necessary to support the Regis Mission.

Doctorate in psychology or related mental health field, plus 1-3 years experience working with adolescents or young adults, preferably in college counseling center setting preferred. Additional experience in working with clients with major mental illness preferred. Masters in psychology or related mental health field, plus 1-3 years experience working with adolescents or young adults, preferably in college counseling center setting required.

Must have appropriate professional license. Successful candidates will be fluent in English and demonstrate good verbal, written, and interpersonal skills; have accurate assessment and crisis intervention skills; have appropriate counseling/therapeutic techniques; conflict management and group leadership/facilitation skills; and basic computer skills. Candidates will have knowledge of a variety of psychological theories and counseling techniques; developmental issues of adolescents and young adults; abnormal psychology; neurological psychology; behavioral health psychology; use of DSM IV-TR classifications; knowledge of psychotropic medications; motivational interviewing; harm prevention strategies; and substance abuse screening/assessments as well as issues that are particularly pertinent to college age students (i.e. eating disorders, substance abuse, post-traumatic stress disorder, anxiety, stress management, depression, and adjustment problems). Also candidates must be knowledgeable re: the State of Colorado Mental Health laws, APA and ACA Codes of Ethics, HIPAA regulations, and ADA.
